Aims: The aims of the course are that students: 1. get familiar with contemporary research in the field of criminology and victimology, with special emphasis on critical analysis of crime recording, as well as on methodology procedures in empirical research and their relationship with theoretical knowledge; 2. acquire current knowledge from the field of material and executive penal law, comparative law as well as international standards3. acquire knowledge about forms of social reaction to crime.
Outcomes: Knowledge about contemporary research methodology in the field of criminology and victimology and ability for individual and team research work.
Contents: <i>Lectures:</i> Crime recording; Criminology and victimology research; Cultural criminology; Violence, gender and social changes; War and crime; Globalization and crime; Study of penal law in larger sense: criminal law, criminal procedure law, criminal executive law, law of economic violations and administrative law; Criteria for distinction of "penal act". Problems of responsibility for "penal act": criminal responsibility of legal entities, new solutions from the Criminal Procedure Act, administrative procedure; Forms of social reaction to crime. <i>Research work:</i> Research projects from criminology and victimology field.
