Conceptual framework: definition of crisis; similarities and differences in terms: crisis, stress and trauma; signs of stress and trauma and their consequences; recovering from trauma. Theoretical explanations of crisis. Crisis events and crisis as psychological state. Types of crisis. Different models of crisis intervention on individual, family, group and community levels. Forms of psychological interventions in specific situations (death loss, job loss, illness etc.). The role of communication skills and counseling in solving of developmental and accidental crisis. Skills of determining appropriate intervention in given circumstances (neither too little, nor too much support); limited goals in crisis intervention focused on the current problem. Evaluation of effects of crisis intervention. Ethic issues of crisis intervention. Crisis prevention: to act proactive rather than reactive. Cognitive and humanistic models of crisis prevention. Preventing burnout syndrome of professionals employed in emergency services. *Practical work:* 

Case studies, analyses of hierarchy of crisis events, elaboration of practical activities in various forms of crisis intervention, analyses empirical data about possible mistakes in crisis
